On our way to 150 carts in 2024

We are on target to meet our goal of producing 150 carts in 2024. To stay on track for that goal, we'll need to continue to make about 3 carts per week. We have a strong group of regular volunteers who have created an efficient workspace and production line able to meet this demand.

To build 1 cart costs \$400 in donations. Now that we have a workspace and a core group of volunteers, our ability to produce carts depends on having enough donations to purchase supplies and materials. This means introducing more people to our mission and letting them know how their donation can help improve people's lives.

We are thankful for everyone who has given as well as the volunteers who faithfully come each week. This is a group effort, and every person and contribution provides a crucial part for producing these carts for people in need.
